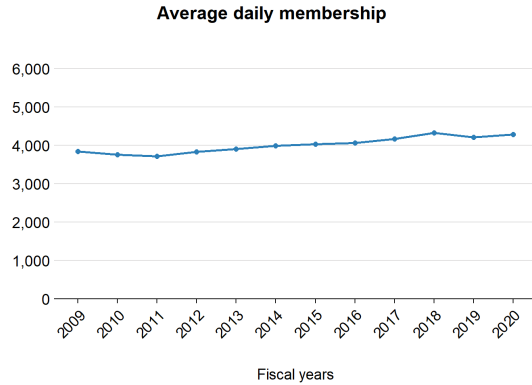


Charlottesville City Schools

This profile shows the most recent data available from the 2019-2020 school year and highlights demographics, staffing, and funding for Charlottesville City Schools.

Students

Enrollment growth between 2008-2009 to 2019-2020 has gone **up** by **11.5%**.



Here are additional characteristics of students that go to Charlottesville City Schools, compared to the state overall.

Staffing

Compared to 2008-2009, there are now fewer staff per student in Charlottesville City Schools.

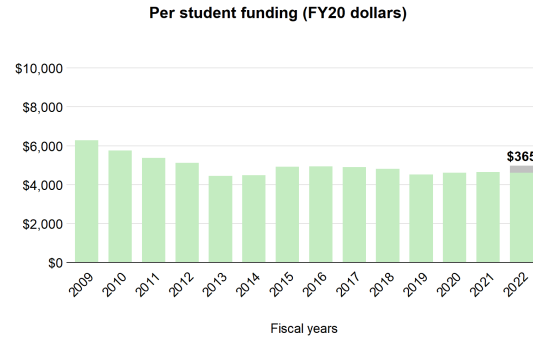
In 2018-2019, there were:

- o 62 more teachers and instructors
- o 42 fewer support staff
- o 2 more school counselors and librarians
- o 5 fewer teacher aides
- o 6 more principals and assistant principals

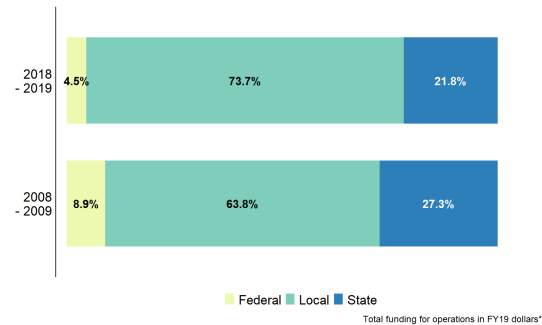
That's **24 more** staff overall, compared to **332 more** students.

Funding

In Charlottesville City Schools, state direct aid per student has **decreased** by **26.6%**, adjusted for inflation. *If the revised Standards of Quality were funded in FY22, this division would receive \$365 additional dollars per student.*



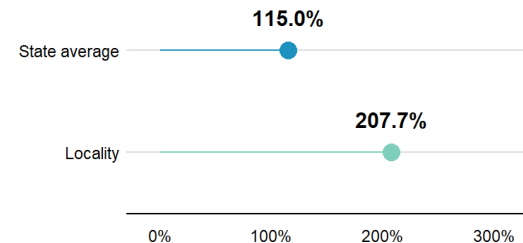
From 2008-09 to 2018-19, the state's share of total funding has **decreased**.
