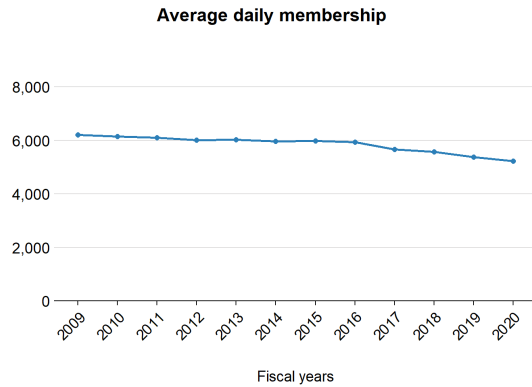


# Danville Public Schools

This profile shows the most recent data available from the 2019-2020 school year and highlights demographics, staffing, and funding for Danville Public Schools.

## Students

Enrollment growth between 2008-2009 to 2019-2020 has gone **down** by **15.8%**.



Here are additional characteristics of students that go to Danville Public Schools, compared to the state overall.

## Staffing

Compared to 2008-2009, there are now fewer staff per student in Danville Public Schools.

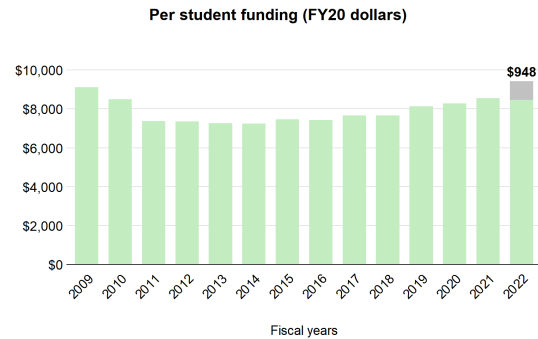
In 2018-2019, there were:

- o 134 fewer teachers and instructors
- o 17 fewer support staff
- o 5 fewer school counselors and librarians
- o 17 more teacher aides
- o 1 fewer principals and assistant principals

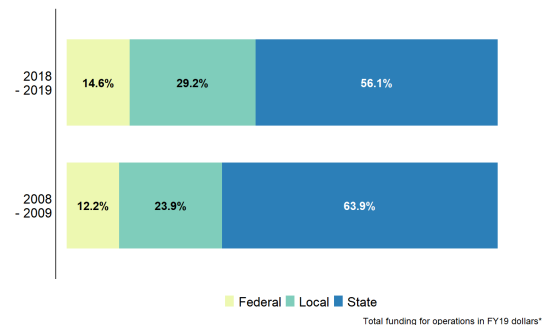
That's **140 fewer** staff overall, compared to **818 fewer** students.

## Funding

In Danville Public Schools, state direct aid per student has **decreased** by **7.1%**, adjusted for inflation. *If the revised Standards of Quality were funded in FY22, this division would receive \$948 additional dollars per student.*



From 2008-09 to 2018-19, the state's share of total funding has **decreased**.
