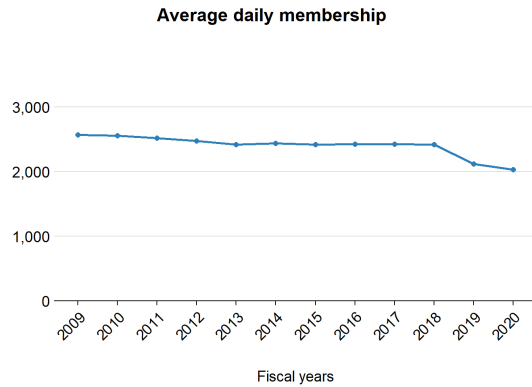


Emporia/Greenville Public Schools

Students

Enrollment growth between 2008-2009 to 2019-2020 has gone **down** by **20.8%**.



Here are additional characteristics of students that go to Emporia/Greenville Public Schools, compared to the state overall.

Staffing

Compared to 2008-2009, there are now more staff per student in Emporia/Greenville Public Schools.

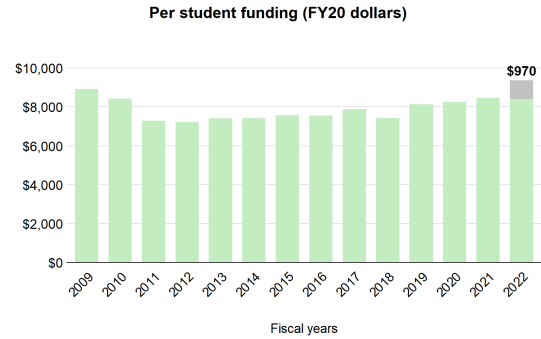
In 2018-2019, there were:

- 16 fewer teachers and instructors
- 25 fewer support staff
- 6 more school counselors and librarians
- 0 more teacher aides
- 2 fewer principals and assistant principals

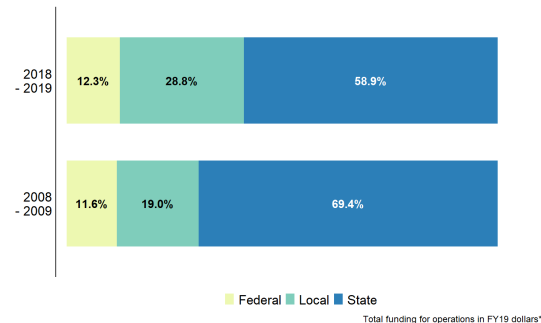
That's **37 fewer** staff overall, compared to **452 fewer** students.

Funding

In Emporia/Greenville Public Schools, state direct aid per student has **decreased** by **5.8%**, adjusted for inflation. *If the revised Standards of Quality were funded in FY22, this division would receive \$970 additional dollars per student.*



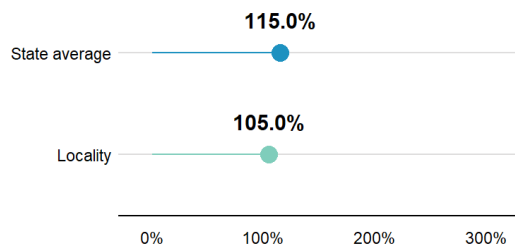
From 2008-09 to 2018-19, the state's share of total funding has **decreased**.
