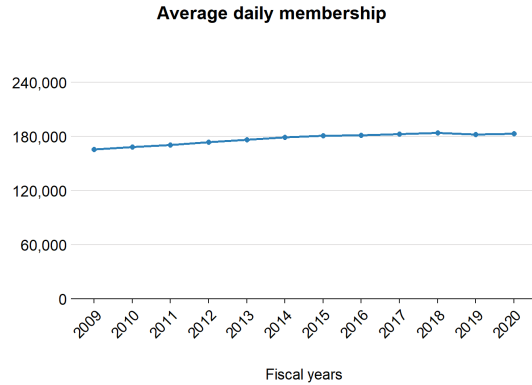


# Fairfax City/County Public Schools

This profile shows the most recent data available from the 2019-2020 school year and highlights demographics, staffing, and funding for Fairfax City/County Public Schools.

## Students

Enrollment growth between 2008-2009 to 2019-2020 has gone **up** by **10.6%**.



Here are additional characteristics of students that go to Fairfax City/County Public Schools, compared to the state overall.

## Staffing

Compared to 2008-2009, there are now fewer staff per student in Fairfax City/County Public Schools.

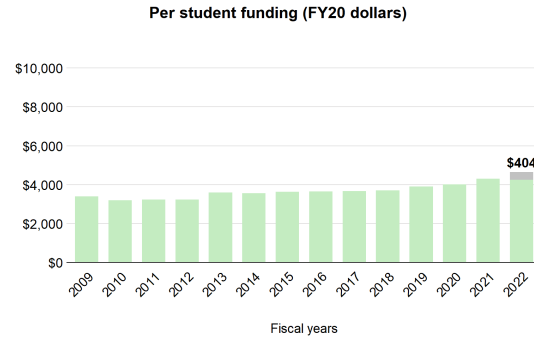
In 2018-2019, there were:

- 1,593 more teachers and instructors
- 476 fewer support staff
- 87 more school counselors and librarians
- 773 more teacher aides
- 55 more principals and assistant principals

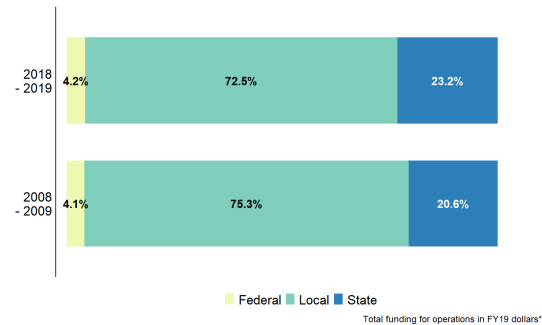
That's **2,033 more** staff overall, compared to **18,165 more** students.

## Funding

In Fairfax City/County Public Schools, state direct aid per student has **increased** by **25.1%**, adjusted for inflation. *If the revised Standards of Quality were funded in FY22, this division would receive \$404 additional dollars per student.*



From 2008-09 to 2018-19, the state's share of total funding has **increased**.
