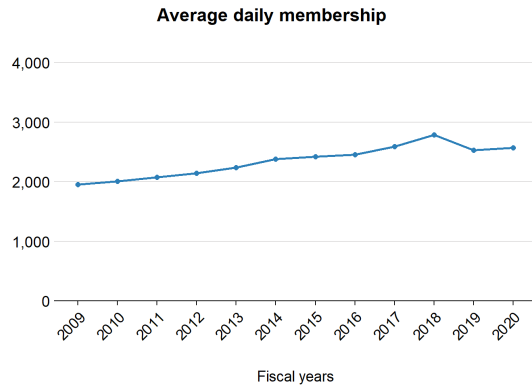


# Falls Church City Public Schools

This profile shows the most recent data available from the 2019-2020 school year and highlights demographics, staffing, and funding for Falls Church City Public Schools.

## Students

Enrollment growth between 2008-2009 to 2019-2020 has gone **up** by **31.7%**.



Here are additional characteristics of students that go to Falls Church City Public Schools, compared to the state overall.

English learners	5.7%	9.0%
Eligible for IDEA services	12.6%	13.5%
Eligible for free or reduced-price lunch	7.2%	45.6%

## Staffing

Compared to 2008-2009, there are now fewer staff per student in Falls Church City Public Schools.

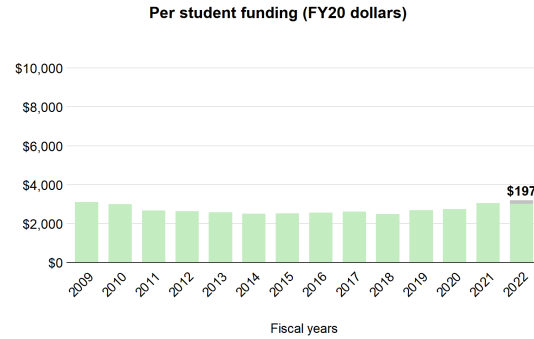
In 2018-2019, there were:

- 20 more teachers and instructors
- 10 more support staff
- 1 more school counselors and librarians
- 5 fewer teacher aides
- 1 more principals and assistant principals

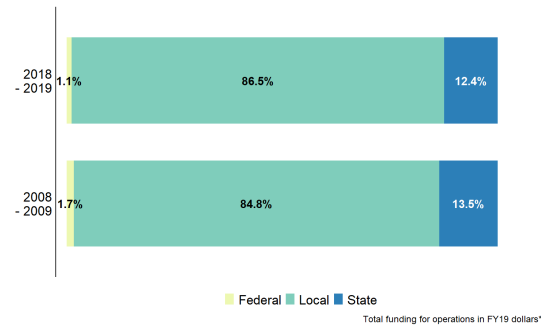
That's **26 more** staff overall, compared to **632 more** students.

## Funding

In Falls Church City Public Schools, state direct aid per student has **decreased** by **3.1%**, adjusted for inflation. *If the revised Standards of Quality were funded in FY22, this division would receive \$197 additional dollars per student.*



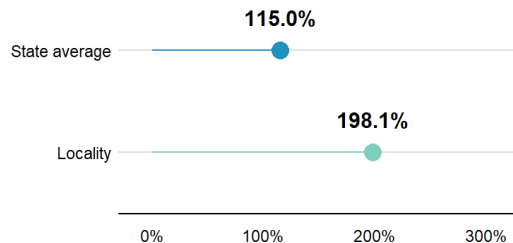
From 2008-09 to 2018-19, the state's share of total funding has **decreased**.
