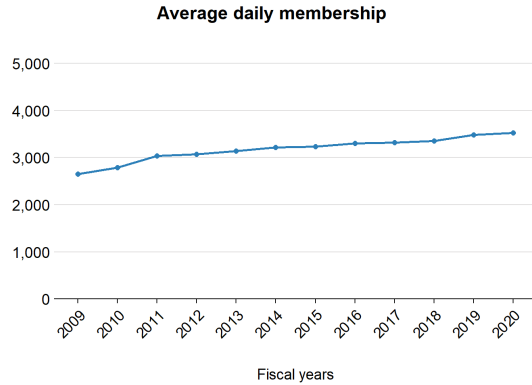


Fredericksburg City Schools

This profile shows the most recent data available from the 2019-2020 school year and highlights demographics, staffing, and funding for Fredericksburg City Schools.

Students

Enrollment growth between 2008-2009 to 2019-2020 has gone **up** by **32.8%**.



Here are additional characteristics of students that go to Fredericksburg City Schools, compared to the state overall.

Staffing

Compared to 2008-2009, there are now fewer staff per student in Fredericksburg City Schools.

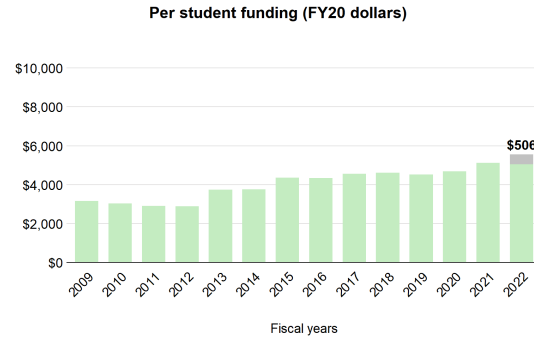
In 2018-2019, there were:

- 35 more teachers and instructors
- 32 more support staff
- 3 more school counselors and librarians
- 22 more teacher aides
- 0 more principals and assistant principals

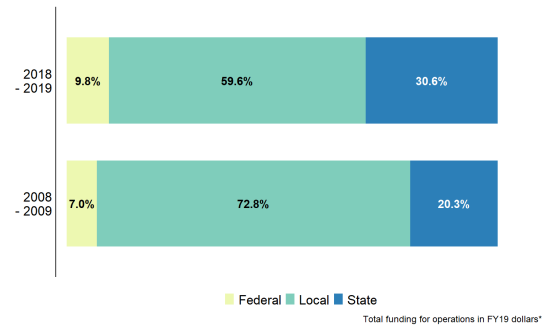
That's **92 more** staff overall, compared to **927 more** students.

Funding

In Fredericksburg City Schools, state direct aid per student has **increased** by **59.9%**, adjusted for inflation. *If the revised Standards of Quality were funded in FY22, this division would receive \$506 additional dollars per student.*



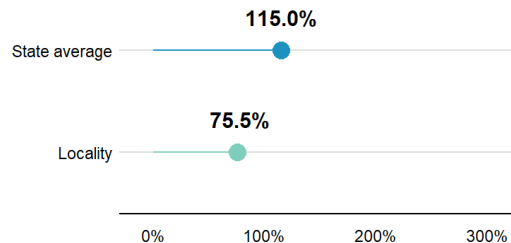
From 2008-09 to 2018-19, the state's share of total funding has **increased**.
