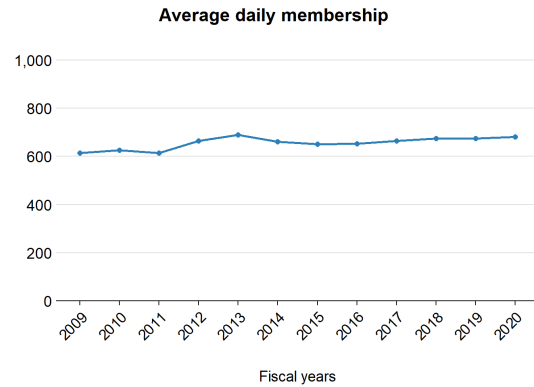


# Lexington City Schools

This profile shows the most recent data available from the 2019-2020 school year and highlights demographics, staffing, and funding for Lexington City Schools.

## Students

Enrollment growth between 2008-2009 to 2019-2020 has gone **up** by **10.9%**.



Here are additional characteristics of students that go to Lexington City Schools, compared to the state overall.

## Staffing

Compared to 2008-2009, there are now more staff per student in Lexington City Schools.

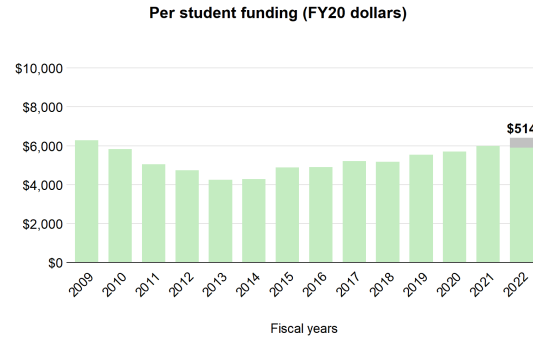
In 2018-2019, there were:

- 8 more teachers and instructors
- 1 more support staff
- 0 more school counselors and librarians
- 0 more teacher aides
- 0 more principals and assistant principals

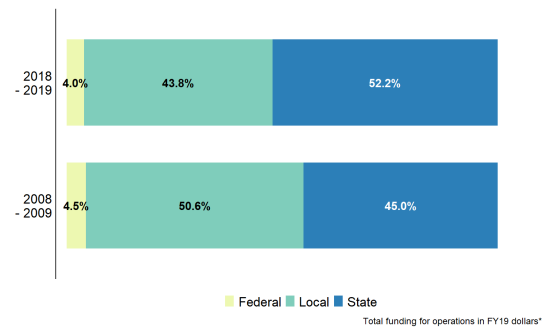
That's **10 more** staff overall, compared to **27 more** students.

## Funding

In Lexington City Schools, state direct aid per student has **decreased** by **6.2%**, adjusted for inflation. *If the revised Standards of Quality were funded in FY22, this division would receive \$514 additional dollars per student.*



From 2008-09 to 2018-19, the state's share of total funding has **increased**.
