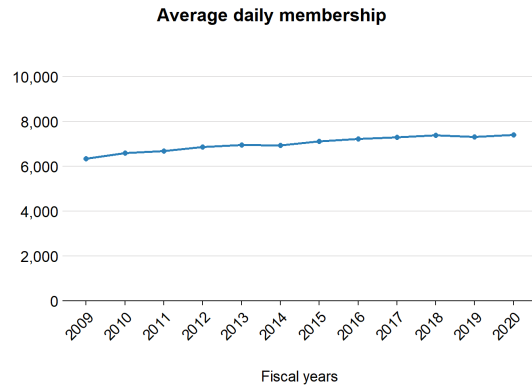


Manassas City Public Schools

Students

Enrollment growth between 2008-2009 to 2019-2020 has gone **up** by **16.9%**.



Here are additional characteristics of students that go to Manassas City Public Schools, compared to the state overall.

Staffing

Compared to 2008-2009, there are now fewer staff per student in Manassas City Public Schools.

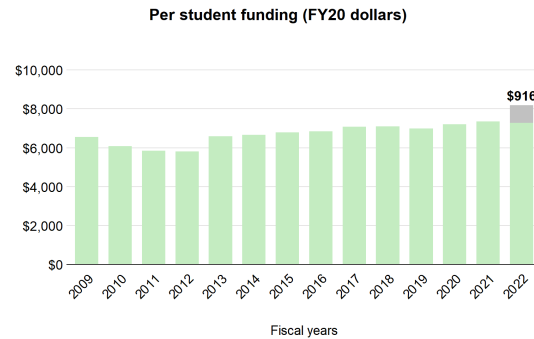
In 2018-2019, there were:

- 8 fewer teachers and instructors
- 87 more support staff
- 5 more school counselors and librarians
- 11 more teacher aides
- 3 more principals and assistant principals

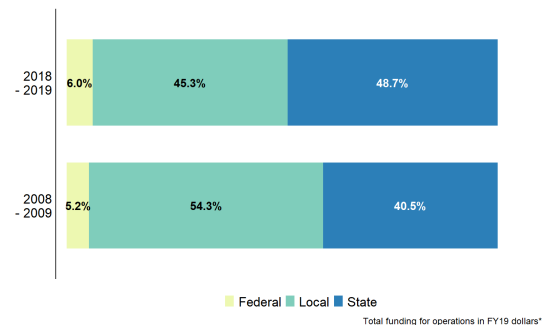
That's **98 more** staff overall, compared to **1,137 more** students.

Funding

In Manassas City Public Schools, state direct aid per student has **increased** by **11.1%**, adjusted for inflation. *If the revised Standards of Quality were funded in FY22, this division would receive \$916 additional dollars per student.*



From 2008-09 to 2018-19, the state's share of total funding has **increased**.
