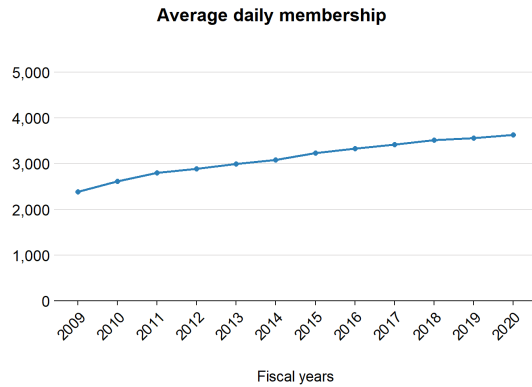


Manassas Park City Schools

Students

Enrollment growth between 2008-2009 to 2019-2020 has gone **up** by **52.3%**.



Here are additional characteristics of students that go to Manassas Park City Schools, compared to the state overall.

Staffing

Compared to 2008-2009, there are now fewer staff per student in Manassas Park City Schools.

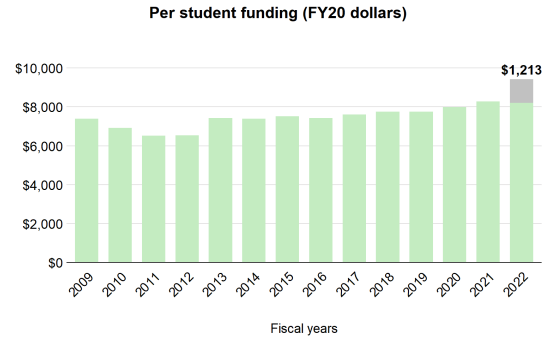
In 2018-2019, there were:

- 72 more teachers and instructors
- 13 more support staff
- 1 more school counselors and librarians
- 18 more teacher aides
- 1 more principals and assistant principals

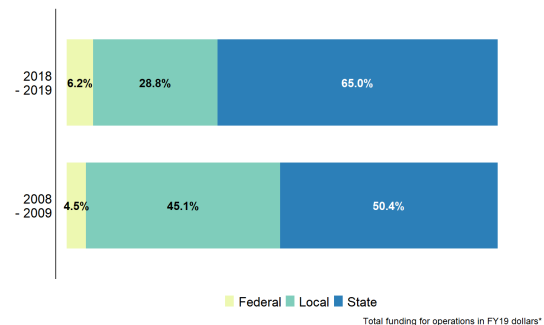
That's **104 more** staff overall, compared to **1,270 more** students.

Funding

In Manassas Park City Schools, state direct aid per student has **increased** by **11.1%**, adjusted for inflation. *If the revised Standards of Quality were funded in FY22, this division would receive \$1,213 additional dollars per student.*



From 2008-09 to 2018-19, the state's share of total funding has **increased**.
