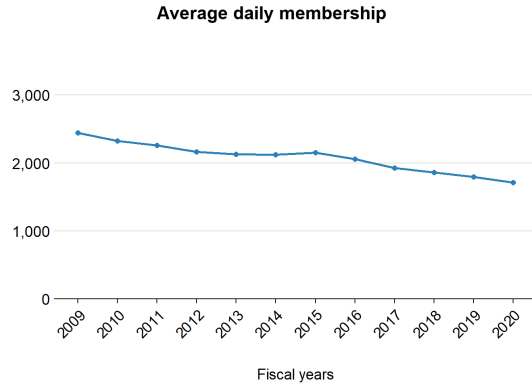


Martinsville City Public Schools

Students

Enrollment growth between 2008-2009 to 2019-2020 has gone **down** by **29.9%**.



Here are additional characteristics of students that go to Martinsville City Public Schools, compared to the state overall.

Staffing

Compared to 2008-2009, there are now more staff per student in Martinsville City Public Schools.

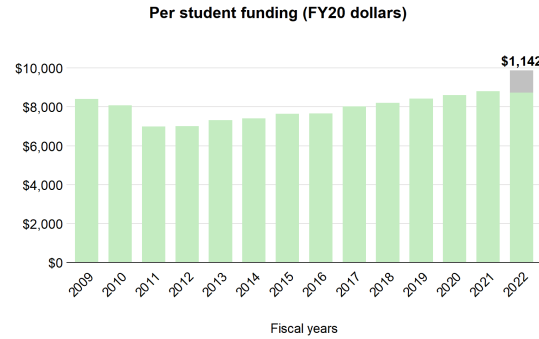
In 2018-2019, there were:

- 31 fewer teachers and instructors
- 23 more support staff
- 2 fewer school counselors and librarians
- 25 fewer teacher aides
- 1 more principals and assistant principals

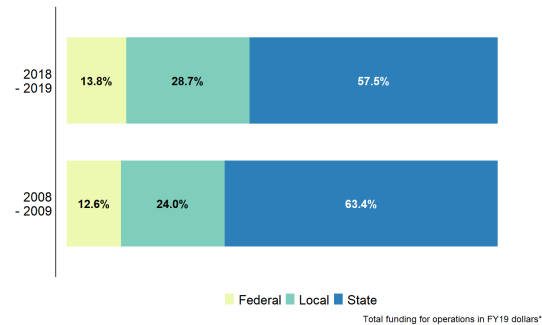
That's **34 fewer** staff overall, compared to **579 fewer** students.

Funding

In Martinsville City Public Schools, state direct aid per student has **increased** by **3.9%**, adjusted for inflation. *If the revised Standards of Quality were funded in FY22, this division would receive \$1,142 additional dollars per student.*



From 2008-09 to 2018-19, the state's share of total funding has **decreased**.
