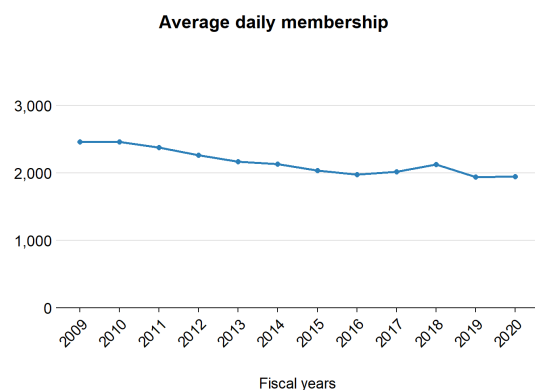


Prince Edward County Public Schools

Students

Enrollment growth between 2008-2009 to 2019-2020 has gone **down** by **21%**.



Here are additional characteristics of students that go to Prince Edward County Public Schools, compared to the state overall.

Staffing

Compared to 2008-2009, there are now fewer staff per student in Prince Edward County Public Schools.

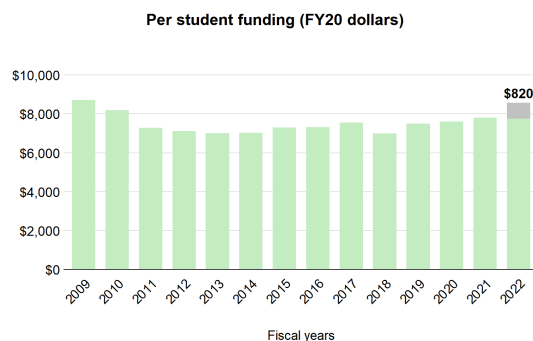
In 2018-2019, there were:

- o 69 fewer teachers and instructors
- o 47 fewer support staff
- o 0 more school counselors and librarians
- o 13 fewer teacher aides
- o 2 more principals and assistant principals

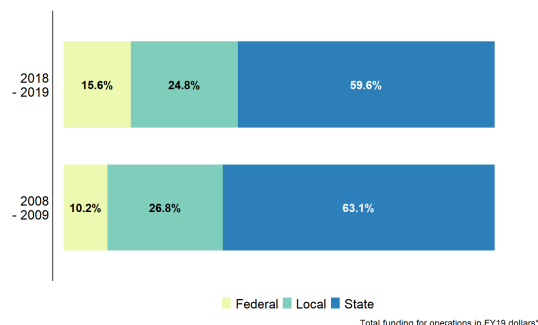
That's **127 fewer** staff overall, compared to **553 fewer** students.

Funding

In Prince Edward County Public Schools, state direct aid per student has **decreased** by **11.2%**, adjusted for inflation. *If the revised Standards of Quality were funded in FY22, this division would receive \$820 additional dollars per student.*



From 2008-09 to 2018-19, the state's share of total funding has **decreased**.
