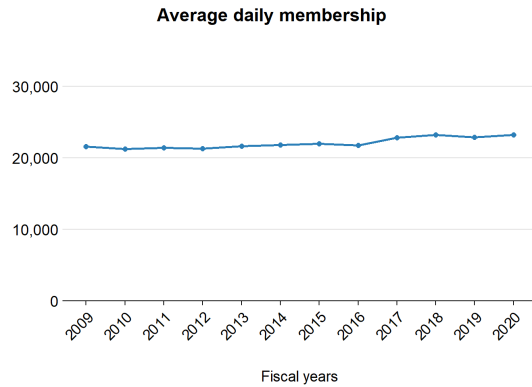


# Richmond Public Schools

This profile shows the most recent data available from the 2019-2020 school year and highlights demographics, staffing, and funding for Richmond Public Schools.

## Students

Enrollment growth between 2008-2009 to 2019-2020 has gone **up** by **7.6%**.



Here are additional characteristics of students that go to Richmond Public Schools, compared to the state overall.

## Staffing

Compared to 2008-2009, there are now fewer staff per student in Richmond Public Schools.

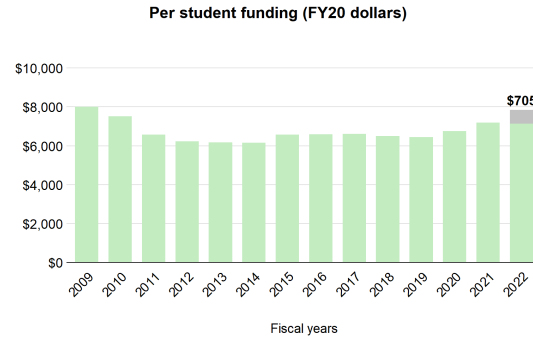
In 2018-2019, there were:

- 327 fewer teachers and instructors
- 117 fewer support staff
- 5 fewer school counselors and librarians
- 102 more teacher aides
- 0 more principals and assistant principals

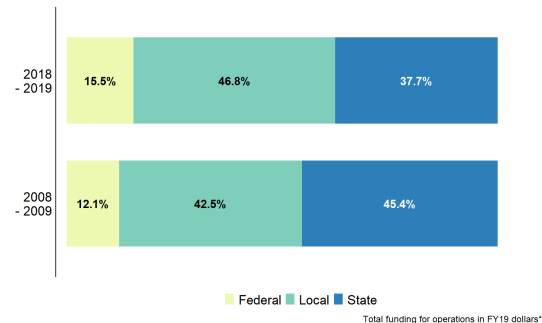
That's **346 fewer** staff overall, compared to **1,438 more** students.

## Funding

In Richmond Public Schools, state direct aid per student has **decreased** by **11%**, adjusted for inflation. *If the revised Standards of Quality were funded in FY22, this division would receive \$705 additional dollars per student.*



From 2008-09 to 2018-19, the state's share of total funding has **decreased**.
