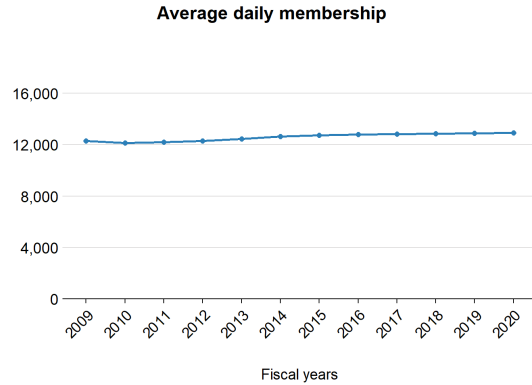


Roanoke City Public Schools

This profile shows the most recent data available from the 2019-2020 school year and highlights demographics, staffing, and funding for Roanoke City Public Schools.

Students

Enrollment growth between 2008-2009 to 2019-2020 has gone **up** by **5.2%**.



Here are additional characteristics of students that go to Roanoke City Public Schools, compared to the state overall.

Staffing

Compared to 2008-2009, there are now fewer staff per student in Roanoke City Public Schools.

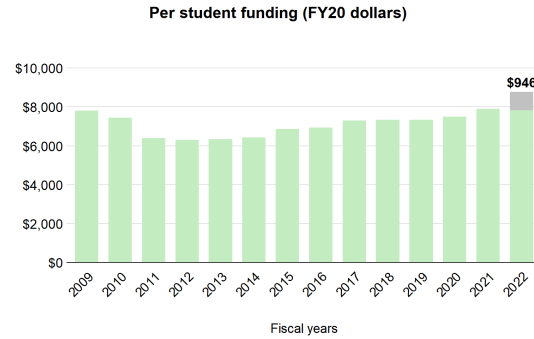
In 2018-2019, there were:

- o 120 fewer teachers and instructors
- o 330 fewer support staff
- o 12 fewer school counselors and librarians
- o 210 more teacher aides
- o 4 more principals and assistant principals

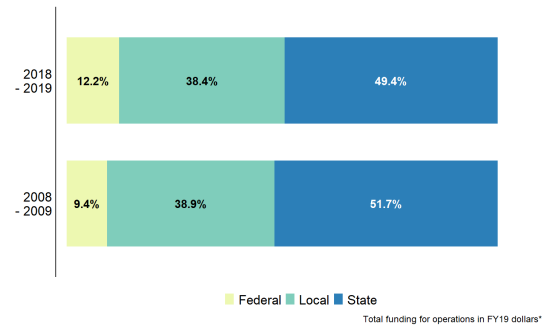
That's **248 fewer** staff overall, compared to **449 more** students.

Funding

In Roanoke City Public Schools, state direct aid per student has **increased** by **0.1%**, adjusted for inflation. *If the revised Standards of Quality were funded in FY22, this division would receive \$946 additional dollars per student.*



From 2008-09 to 2018-19, the state's share of total funding has **decreased**.
