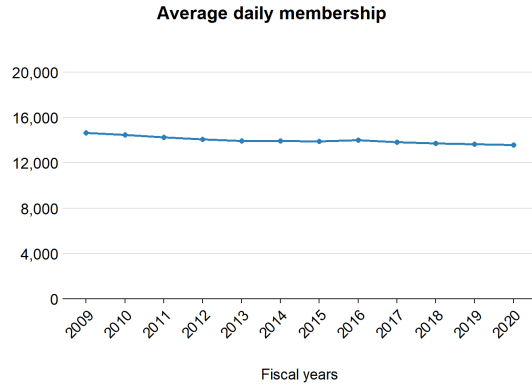


Roanoke County Public Schools

This profile shows the most recent data available from the 2019-2020 school year and highlights demographics, staffing, and funding for Roanoke County Public Schools.

Students

Enrollment growth between 2008-2009 to 2019-2020 has gone **down** by **7.2%**.



Here are additional characteristics of students that go to Roanoke County Public Schools, compared to the state overall.

Staffing

Compared to 2008-2009, there are now fewer staff per student in Roanoke County Public Schools.

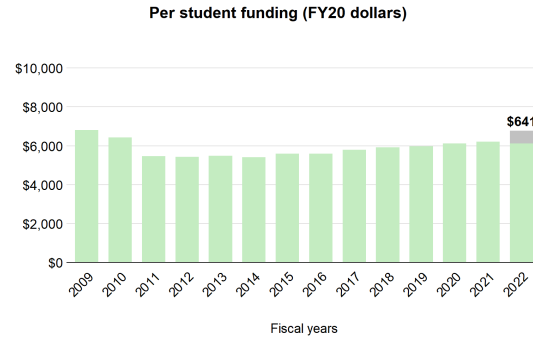
In 2018-2019, there were:

- 77 fewer teachers and instructors
- 145 fewer support staff
- 8 fewer school counselors and librarians
- 25 more teacher aides
- 6 fewer principals and assistant principals

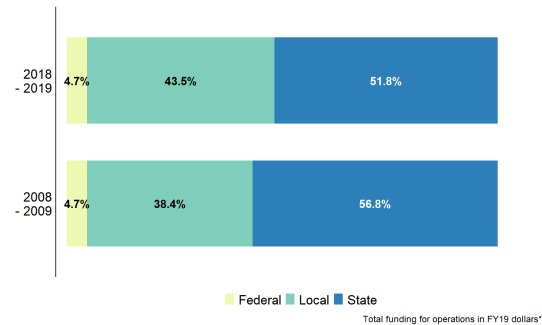
That's **211 fewer** staff overall, compared to **874 fewer** students.

Funding

In Roanoke County Public Schools, state direct aid per student has **decreased** by **10%**, adjusted for inflation. *If the revised Standards of Quality were funded in FY22, this division would receive \$641 additional dollars per student.*



From 2008-09 to 2018-19, the state's share of total funding has **decreased**.
