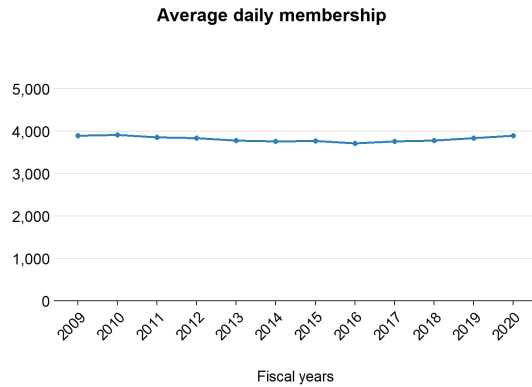


Salem City Schools

Students

Enrollment growth between 2008-2009 to 2019-2020 has gone **down** by **0.1%**.



Here are additional characteristics of students that go to Salem City Schools, compared to the state overall.

Staffing

Compared to 2008-2009, there are now fewer staff per student in Salem City Schools.

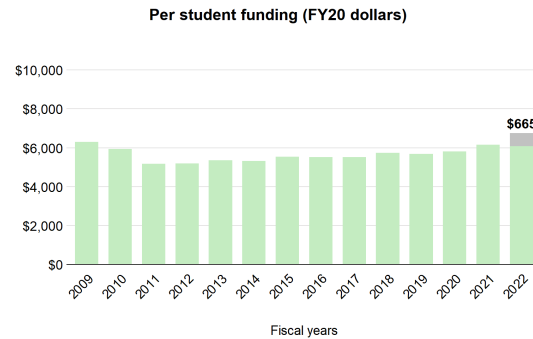
In 2018-2019, there were:

- 12 fewer teachers and instructors
- 12 fewer support staff
- 2 fewer school counselors and librarians
- 5 fewer teacher aides
- 0 more principals and assistant principals

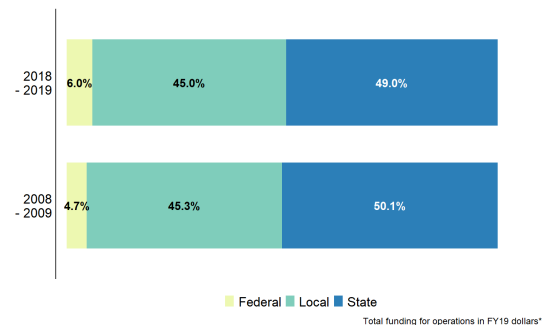
That's **30 fewer** staff overall, compared to **3 fewer** students.

Funding

In Salem City Schools, state direct aid per student has **decreased** by **3.6%**, adjusted for inflation. *If the revised Standards of Quality were funded in FY22, this division would receive \$665 additional dollars per student.*



From 2008-09 to 2018-19, the state's share of total funding has **decreased**.
