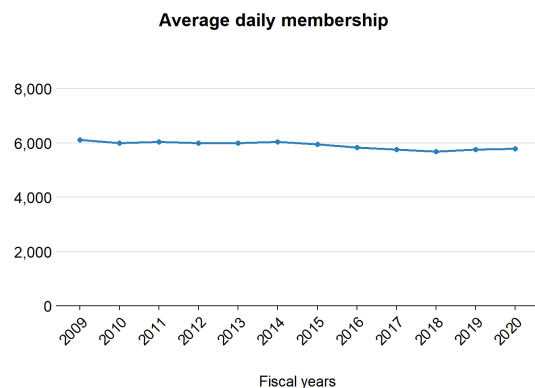


# Shenandoah County Public Schools

This profile shows the most recent data available from the 2019-2020 school year and highlights demographics, staffing, and funding for Shenandoah County Public Schools.

## Students

Enrollment growth between 2008-2009 to 2019-2020 has gone **down** by **5.4%**.



Here are additional characteristics of students that go to Shenandoah County Public Schools, compared to the state overall.

## Staffing

Compared to 2008-2009, there are now more staff per student in Shenandoah County Public Schools.

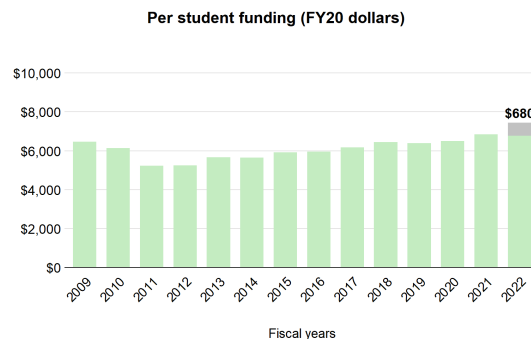
In 2018-2019, there were:

- 15 more teachers and instructors
- 24 more support staff
- 2 more school counselors and librarians
- 7 fewer teacher aides
- 5 more principals and assistant principals

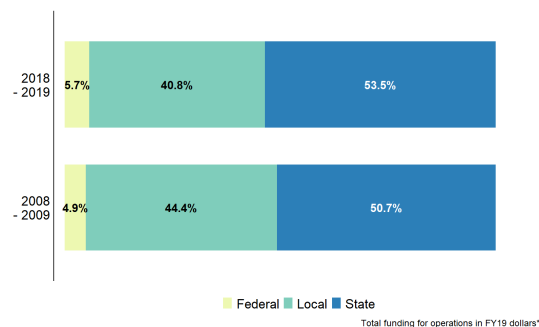
That's **39 more** staff overall, compared to **315 fewer** students.

## Funding

In Shenandoah County Public Schools, state direct aid per student has **increased** by **4.8%**, adjusted for inflation. *If the revised Standards of Quality were funded in FY22, this division would receive \$680 additional dollars per student.*



From 2008-09 to 2018-19, the state's share of total funding has **increased**.
