
Suffolk Public Schools

Students

Enrollment growth between 2008-2009 to 2019-2020 has gone **up** by **0.4%**.



Here are additional characteristics of students that go to Suffolk Public Schools, compared to the state overall.

Staffing

Compared to 2008-2009, there are now fewer staff per student in Suffolk Public Schools.


In 2018-2019, there were:

- o 62 fewer teachers and instructors
- o 50 fewer support staff
- o 6 fewer school counselors and librarians
- o 82 fewer teacher aides
- o 2 more principals and assistant principals

That's **198 fewer** staff overall, compared to **248 more** students.

Funding

In Suffolk Public Schools, state direct aid per student has **decreased** by **13%**, adjusted for inflation. If the revised Standards of Quality were funded in FY22, this division would receive \$704 additional dollars per student.



From 2008-09 to 2018-19, the state's share of total funding has **decreased.**
