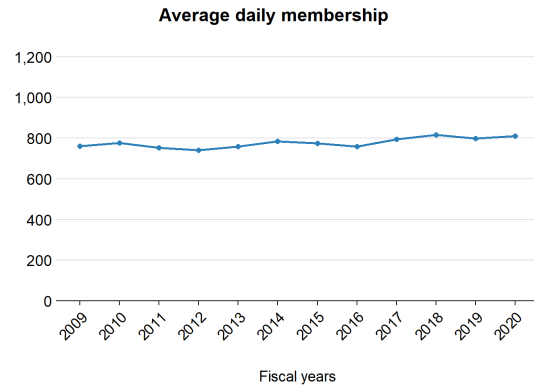


West Point Public Schools

Students

Enrollment growth between 2008-2009 to 2019-2020 has gone **up** by **6.6%**.



Here are additional characteristics of students that go to West Point Public Schools, compared to the state overall.

Staffing

Compared to 2008-2009, there are now fewer staff per student in West Point Public Schools.

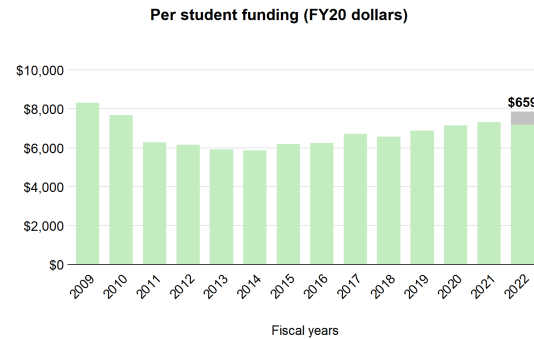
In 2018-2019, there were:

- 7 fewer teachers and instructors
- 1 more support staff
- 5 more school counselors and librarians
- 0 more teacher aides
- 1 more principals and assistant principals

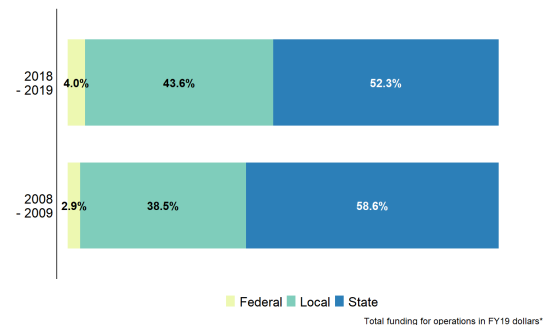
That's **0 more** staff overall, compared to **53 more** students.

Funding

In West Point Public Schools, state direct aid per student has **decreased** by **13.5%**, adjusted for inflation. *If the revised Standards of Quality were funded in FY22, this division would receive \$659 additional dollars per student.*



From 2008-09 to 2018-19, the state's share of total funding has **decreased**.
