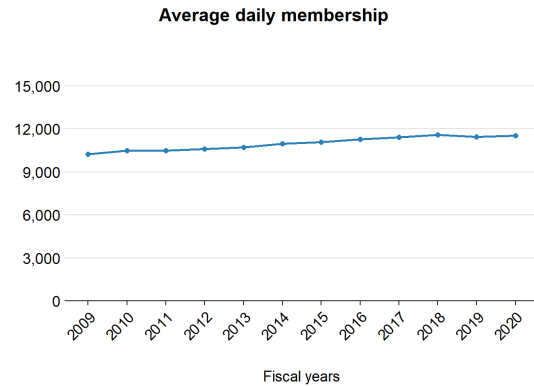


Williamsburg/James City Public Schools

Students

Enrollment growth between 2008-2009 to 2019-2020 has gone **up** by **12.5%**.



Here are additional characteristics of students that go to Williamsburg/James City Public Schools, compared to the state overall.

Staffing

Compared to 2008-2009, there are now fewer staff per student in Williamsburg/James City Public Schools.

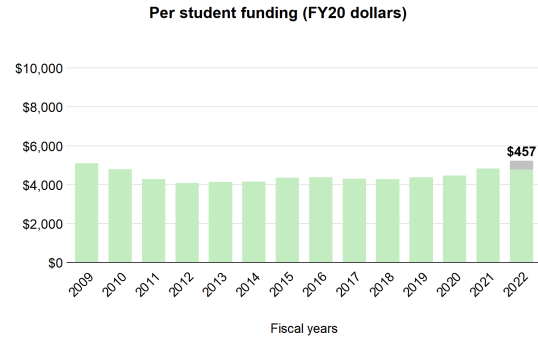
In 2018-2019, there were:

- 52 more teachers and instructors
- 3 more support staff
- 5 more school counselors and librarians
- 9 more teacher aides
- 2 more principals and assistant principals

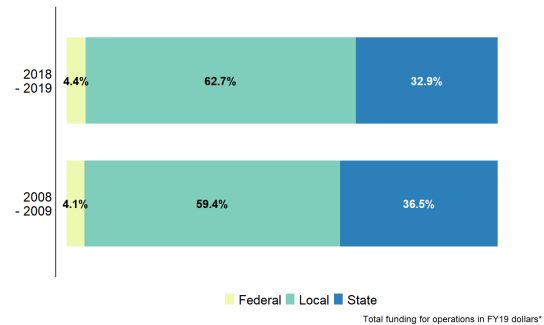
That's **72 more** staff overall, compared to **1,108 more** students.

Funding

In Williamsburg/James City Public Schools, state direct aid per student has **decreased** by **6.4%**, adjusted for inflation. *If the revised Standards of Quality were funded in FY22, this division would receive \$457 additional dollars per student.*



From 2008-09 to 2018-19, the state's share of total funding has **decreased**.
