VA Legislative Sessions

- → They are *short* in duration.
- → In even numbered years (non-election years) = 60 days
- → In odd numbered years (election years) = 45 days
- → The session may be extended by a 2/3 majority vote in both houses.
- → Both the Governor and the General Assembly (with 2/3 majority vote in both houses) can call for a special session.

- → 100 members; current split is 51 Ds; 48 Rs*
- → 2 year terms, no term limits
- → Current speaker-elect: Don Scott (D-HD 88)
- → Majority control means that minority party can't do much unless a few members in the other party agree

*HD 82 is currently undergoing a recounting process

Lt. Gov. Winsome Sears

- → 40 members; current split is 21 Ds; 19 Rs
- \rightarrow 4 year terms, no term limits
- → Sen. Lucas (D) is President Pro Tempore; Lt Gov Winsome Sears (R) presides over the Senate
- → LG not merely a ceremonial role; Sears can break ties in certain instances




- → Best tool to track filed legislation, review list of members & their votes on bills, committee assignments, etc.
- Can look up past sessions to see how legislation faired; can also see prior fiscal impact statements / amendments / etc.
- Ability to sign up for automatic notifications for limited number of bills

Say what?

- → Pass by for the day: a bill, even if scheduled for debate that day, will be brought up at a later date (allows time for changes)
- → PBI "Pass by Indefinitely": means the bill is dead, committee isn't going to act on it.
- → Lay the bill on the table: suspends debate on a bill, it can be restarted later, but that rarely happens, usually means gentle death
- → Crossover: Deadline for each chamber to act on its own legislation
- → Reconvened: Means the veto session, lawmakers return to consider Gov's amendments and vetoes

The Budget Process

- 2 year budgets (i.e., the biennium)
- Caboose: amendments to the biennial budget because predictions of revenues can fall short or be more than what actually occurred.



Final Notes

- → Budget can be a tool for policy change (e.g., language only amendments).
- → What happens when budget conflicts a provision in VA's code? Budget wins.
- → In general, new laws take effect on July 1 unless otherwise specified. Caboose budget bill takes effect upon Gov's signature.
- → 501(c)(3) organizations can talk policy and can engage in lobbying on policy issues within certain limits and with required reporting. Bolder Advocacy is a resource on 501(c)(3) rules for advocacy.

Advocacy During Session

- → Constituent meetings: Meeting with lawmakers, testifying in committee
- → Take action: Encouraging the public to take action on legislation (e.g., emailing, calling / texting lawmakers, attend a rally)
- → Make Your Voice Heard: Social media outreach, op-eds, press interviews, press conferences, talk to a neighbor, etc.

Building an Advocacy Campaign - A Case Study on EITC

- → 2022 EITC Campaign: Governor Northam had included EITC in his outgoing budget
- → Setting a Strategy: Advocates worked to educate lawmakers in the State Senate about EITC and ensure that it was included in the final budget
- → Prioritize Parents: Social media outreach, op-eds, press interviews, press conferences, centered in voices of parents
