About the Position

The State Policy Fellowship is a two-year, full-time paid staff opportunity to develop in-depth policy expertise. You'll be part of a national cohort of fellows coordinated by the Center on Budget and Policy Priorities who are working in state organizations to drive policy change. At TCI, the position will focus on research and analysis of issues related to the many factors that affect a wide range of health outcomes, including where people are born, live, learn, work, and play.

Fellows will work as research analysts and will:

- Develop expertise in state budget and tax policies.
- Dive deeper into the policy area of equitable health care access and issues related to the social determinants of health including the intersections of health and housing, immigration, education finance, family economic security, economic development, and criminal justice.
- Work in partnership with community-based leaders to develop community-driven reforms and policy proposals.
- Produce reports, graphics, and other materials for use by policymakers, stakeholders, journalists, advocacy groups, and civic organizations.
- Track and analyze legislative proposals and state budget developments.
- Engage with media, policymakers and their staffs, and a broad array of national, state, and community organizations to help inform and shape policy debates.
